

LICENSE AGREEMENT

between

Georg Thieme Verlag KG, a company
Rüdigerstraße 14, D-70469 Stuttgart, Germany

– hereinafter referred to as the “Publisher”–

and

Lithuanian Research Library Consortium
Lithuania

– hereinafter referred to as the “Licensee”–

1. Subject of the Agreement

1.1 The Publisher, as the owner of the reproduction rights, hereby grants the Licensee a restricted, non transferable, non-exclusive right to use the digitalised online edition of the Publisher’s works and/or web-based software applications, including any new editions/updates developed by the Publisher, under the terms and conditions specified below (hereinafter called the “**Licensed Works**”).

The Licensed Works are listed in a separate Attachment. Any additional works will be licensed by means of a supplement or amendment to said Attachment, by mutual consent between the Parties; the terms of the present Agreement shall also apply to any additional works.

The rights of use granted to the Licensee with regard to authorized persons or sites are specified in the **Attachment**.

1.2 The Publisher will usually make the Licensed Works available on a server so that said works can be accessed via the Internet. All persons authorized to use said works may display the Licensed Works by means of read-only access, and they may also locally store or print out individual articles and other items in a reasonable number for individual use. These articles may, however, not be stored in electronic or electromagnetic form beyond this limit, and no further reproductions of these articles or the Licensed Works (not even in part) shall be permitted.

In principle, the Licensee may access the Licensed Works via the Internet Protocol (hereinafter, “IP”) addresses (authentication via the IP address) to be indicated by the Licensee. However, the Licensee may also access the licensed works via passwords in individual cases.

1.3 The Licensed Works are copyright-protected. Any further use or the transfer of the rights of use is subject to the prior written consent of the Publisher.

2. Provision of the Licensed Works

The Publisher will make the Licensed Works available for access on the agreed date of provision, but no earlier than within five (5) business days following receipt of the signed Agreement. The date of provision regarding the Licensed Works is indicated in the **Attachment**.

The Licensee will notify the Publisher of the necessary information (such as IP address, system administrator, relevant contact

addresses, etc.) no later than two (2) weeks prior to the date of provision of the Licensed Works.

3. License Fee – Adjustment – Due Date

3.1 The license fee for the Licensed Works to be paid per calendar year is stipulated in the **Attachment**. In addition, the relevant factors with regard to the license fee when this Agreement is concluded are also indicated in the **Attachment**.

In the event that the license fee – as indicated in the **Attachment** – depends on the number of sites of the Licensee, the number of authorized persons, the total number of staff, or any other factor, the Licensee will notify the Publisher of any material change without delay. The term ‘material’ – in relation to the relevant Licensed Work – means any change in relation to the number of authorized persons or to the total number of staff with regard to the threshold value indicated in the **Attachment**, or any change in the number of sites, or any change with regard to other factors. In this case, the Publisher will be entitled to adjust the license fee at its own reasonable discretion. It will be obliged to do so if any changes arise in favor of the Licensee. Such adjustment will be made with effect from the calendar year following the year in which the adjustment has occurred. If the Licensee fails to notify the Publisher of any change that has occurred in its favor, the Licensee may only request an adjustment from the point in time when the change notice has been received. The Licensee has the right to disagree with any unforeseen fee increase and in such case has the right to terminate the contract with 30 days prior notice and acquires the right to reimbursement of the proportionate amount of the fee paid but not used.

3.2 In addition to the license fee according to section 3.1 – in connection with the Attachment specified therein –, any VAT or other sales tax amount that may have accrued under the relevant statutory requirements must be invoiced by Publisher in the respective statutory amount.

3.3 The Publisher will charge the license fee for all Licensed Works on a yearly basis and in advance, i.e. on a prorata basis for the respective work – or as indicated in the **Attachment** –, in the year when the Agreement is concluded, including any VAT or sales tax accrued, and will be due for payment sixty (60) days after the invoice date without deduction.

3.4 The Licensee may only offset any claim against the Publisher if such claim is uncontested or has been adjudicated by means of a final (non-appealable) judgement of a court of law. The Licensee is not entitled to enforce any rights of retention.

3.5 not applicable.

3.6 The Licensee may interact directly with the Publisher or through a sales agency or similar agent. If a sales agency is involved the Publisher balances its services and performances with the sales agency and the sales agency with the Licensee. Sections 3.1 to 3.5 shall not apply between the Publisher and the Licensee; only the trading terms and conditions agreed in the respective contractual relationship apply.

4. Limitation of Liability

4.1 The Publisher will eliminate any defects in the online edition of the Licensed Works provided that the Licensee has notified the Publisher in the context of the customary changes/updates of the Publisher. No-fault liability will not apply.

4.2 In the event of any disturbance with regard to the server of the Publisher, the obligation to pay the license fee will be reduced to the extent of such disturbance, until such disturbance has been eliminated. This shall not apply to disturbances which are of minor importance in relation to the term of this Agreement, or in the case of routine maintenance work.

Furthermore, both Parties may terminate this Agreement without notice with regard to the Licensed Works affected by such disturbance if the disturbance has not been eliminated within one (1) month.

4.3 The Licensee is not entitled to enforce any claims for damages, regardless of the cause in law. This shall not apply in cases of wilful intent or gross negligence, injury to life, body or health, liability under the applicable product liability act, or any guarantee assumed, or any damage caused by a culpable breach of material contractual obligations, or in any other case where liability is mandatory under applicable law. Liability for breach of material contractual obligations shall, however, be limited to reimbursement of the foreseeable damage that is typical under the Agreement unless the damage has been caused by wilful intent or gross negligence, or if liability is mandatory in the case of injury to life, body or health.

No reversal of the burden of proof is required with regard to the above terms.

5. Term of the Agreement – Termination

5.1 This Agreement is concluded for a period, indicated in Annex (Tender) and may be terminated by either Party with three (3) months' notice to the end of a calendar year, and, on the first occasion, with effect from the point in time indicated in the **Attachment**.

If, for the termination of individual Licensed Works, no separate license fee is specified in the **Attachment** for the terminated works, the Publisher will be obliged to adjust the license fee at its own reasonable discretion in such a case.

In the event, the opt-out of an Authorised Institution has become effective, Licensee may terminate this Agreement by serving a written notice to the other party (The termination will become effective thirty days after the receipt of the written notice unless a later term has been specified in the notice. In this case, **the Licensee** shall pay only for the access and use of the Licensed Material by the Authorised Users of the Authorised Institutions during the period of the validity of this Agreement); Licensee may further terminate this Agreement in writing if the License was awarded to **the Publisher** in view of a serious infringement of the obligations under the Treaties and Directive 2014/24/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council of 26 February 2014 on public procurement and repealing Directive 2004/18/EC that has been declared by the Court of Justice of the European Union in a procedure pursuant to Article 258 TFEU (Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union); or if the Agreement has been subject to a substantial modification of the Agreement; or if **the Publisher** should have been excluded during the procurement procedure; or if the international sanctions are applied to the Publisher according to the Law on International Sanctions of the Republic of Lithuania; or if **the Publisher** does not submit an invoice in due time. Upon termination of this Agreement according to this clause, **the Publisher** shall reimburse to **the Licensee** a pro rata proportion of the then remaining paid Fee for the unexpired period of this Agreement.

5.2 Each notice of termination must be made in the written form.

6. Final Provisions

6.1 The Licensee will treat as confidential any commercial, technical or other information - including the terms of this Agreement - which the Licensee has become aware of during this contractual relationship. This shall also apply to the period following the termination of the Agreement. The parties acknowledge that the Agreement, its annexes and the Tender shall be published on Lithuanian Central Public Procurement Information System.

The Parties undertake to process personal data only under the conditions specified in this Agreement, in compliance with Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC, the Law on Legal Protection of Personal Data of the Republic of Lithuania, and other legal acts governing the processing and protection of personal data.

6.2 The Publisher is entitled to transfer the contractual relationship to a third party in the event of any disposal of the Licensed Works. The third party receiving the Licensed Works will become the exclusive contracting party of the Licensee, including all rights and obligations resulting from the contractual relationship.

6.3 The provisions of substantive law applicable within the Federal Republic of Germany shall apply except where mandatory conditions of the Lithuanian Law on Public Procurement are applicable. And the principles of the conflict of laws under private international law, which would justify the applicability of any other foreign law, shall not apply.

6.4 Any amendments or supplements to this Agreement must be made in the written form to be legally effective. No verbal ancillary agreements have been made.

6.5 If any of the provisions of this Agreement is held to be or becomes invalid, this will not affect the legal effectiveness of the other terms of this Agreement. The voided provision will be replaced by a provision which is as close as possible to the intended commercial purpose of the voided provision in a legally permissible manner. This shall also apply to any gaps in the Agreement

The signatory confirms that access to the Licensed Works is strictly limited to the Sites and IP addresses as specified in this Attachment.

c) Cf. 1.1 Authorized Users:

Authorized Users are defined as permanent or temporary employees, including students, who work within the premises of the sites given above. For academic institutions walk-in members of the general public are considered Authorized Users only when using Licensee's terminal within the sites of the Licensee given above.

Making available the Licensed Works to the Authorized Users outside the locations of the Licensee (e. g., remote access via username/password) shall be permitted.

The number of concurrent users will be determined including all simultaneous users from a given institution – whether they are using the site from within Licensee's IP address or via remote access.

d) Cf. 1.3 Copyright:

The usage of the material licensed under this Agreement is subject to the following:

The entire copyright in the material licensed shall be and remain in the name of the Publisher, subject only to the rights granted herein. Licensee shall take all necessary measures to protect said copyright in all places where Licensee provides access to the licensed material, including any internet-based network or domain.

In particular, duty of care includes maintaining an appropriate standard of confidentiality. Authorized Users may not divulge, copy, release, sell, or loan any confidential information except as properly authorized by the Publisher. Such information includes but is not limited to any password assigned to Authorized Users in the course of a registration process to access our online systems.

Licensee shall, upon gaining knowledge of alleged rights infringements or at the Publisher's reasonable request, investigate alleged cases of misuse or infringement within the frame of this Agreement, including but not limited to sharing of user credentials with non-authorized users or any other case of facilitating access to Publisher's server for non-authorized users. Licensee shall report to the Publisher providing as much information about the breach of security and unauthorized access and respond to such cases by taking appropriate measures within 10 working days of receiving notice from the Publisher to terminate said misuse or infringement. In the event Licensee fails to respond to such incidents in a timely manner the Publisher shall be entitled to terminate access to the licensed works for IP addresses identified as having been used to engage in the above misuse or infringement.

The license fee for the year 2026 is EURO 10.063,90 excl. VAT. The fee including VAT and fee for subsequent subscription period are indicated in Annex (the Tender).

If, during the performance of the Licence Agreement, the legal acts regulating the payment of VAT change in a way that

directly affects the Fee, the Fee including VAT shall be recalculated according to the law without changing the Fee excluding VAT. The recalculated Fee shall be formalised by an amendment and applied from the date the new VAT rate enters into force and must be applicable. If the VAT rate increases and the Institution has no available funding to cover the increased cost, the financing period shall be adjusted accordingly, or the Agreement shall be terminated, with a pro rata refund provided for the unused portion of the subscription period

g) Cf. 3.1 Material Changes

An additional and separate License Agreement is needed if the Licensee intends to include Sites that are not part of this agreement.

h) Cf. 5.1 Termination of the License Agreement

j) Additional Agreements from tender

1. Terms of payment:

6.1. The Publisher shall provide financial documents (invoices) to the Licensee at their own expense only electronically. Electronic invoices complying with the European standard for electronic

invoicing, the reference of which was published on 16 October 2017 in the Commission Implementing Decision (EU) 2017/1870 on the reference of the European standard for electronic invoicing and the publication of the list of syntax in accordance with Directive 2014/55 EU of the European Parliament and of the Council (OJ 2017 L 266, p. 19) (hereinafter – European electronic invoice standard) provided by the means chosen by the Publisher. Electronic invoices that do not comply with the European standard for electronic invoicing may only be submitted using the means of SABIS informational system (<https://sabis.nbfc.lt/>). The Licensee accepts and processes electronic invoices using the information system SABIS means, except in the case of mobilization, war or emergency, when the information system is damaged for which communication and exchange of information between the Licensee and the Publisher using this system is not possible, therefore invoices may be submitted by non-electronic means during the performance of the Agreement. For the purposes of this paragraph, an electronic invoice shall mean an invoice issued, transmitted, and received in an electronic format that allows it to be processed automatically and electronically.

6.1.1. Payments will be made in the following order:

(i) within 60 (sixty) calendar days from the date the Licensee receives the invoice. The Publisher will invoice the Licensee with invoices in the maximum amount and for the period indicated in Annex (Tender).

No later than by 10 December 2025 the Supplier shall issue to the Licensee the first invoice in the amount indicated in Item 3, Annex (Tender) as payable for the year 2026. If the Supplier fails to issue the invoice to Licensee at a fixed date, it shall be considered that the Supplier has refused to provide the service and therefore he shall lose his right to receive the payment and the Agreement shall be considered as terminated.

The Supplier shall submit other invoices on the dates agreed between the parties by email. If the submission of the invoice on the agreed deadlines is overdue, it shall be considered that the Supplier has refused to provide the service for that particular year and the Agreement shall be terminated. In such case the Supplier shall lose his right to the reimbursement of any losses.

A member of the Licensee's consortium may opt out of this Agreement during the Term. Notice of such a decision must be made prior to the beginning of the next subscription Term and will be effective on January 1 of the following calendar year. In the event a member of the Licensee's consortium opts out of this Agreement, such consortium member's Fee will be deducted from the invoice for the year in which such opting out is to be effective. The parties acknowledge that any amendments to this Agreement shall be subject to the requirements set forth in Article 89 of the Law on Public Procurement of the Republic of Lithuania.

The Supplier must ensure compliance with the Law on the Accessibility of Products and Services of the Republic of Lithuania, which defines the scope of application, exemptions, and the supplier’s liability for non-compliance <https://www.e-tar.lt/portal/lt/legalAct/8869165081dc11ed8df094f359a60216>. According to the law, e-books must meet the following accessibility requirements:
 - 5.1. When an e-book contains both text and audio content, synchronization between the text and audio must be ensured;
 - 5.2. It must be ensured that digital e-book files do not interfere with the proper functioning of assistive technologies;
 - 5.3. Access to the content must be provided, including navigation within the file, format structure (including dynamic formats), flexibility, and options for content presentation;
 - 5.4. Possibilities must be provided for alternative content delivery and its interoperability with various assistive technologies in a perceivable, understandable, usable, and sustainable manner;
 - 5.5. E-books must be findable by including metadata that provides information about their accessibility features;
 - 5.6. Digital rights management tools must not block accessibility features.
6. The MedOne platform should offer a personal registration for users in order to get access from home. It should be possible to create personal content collections in “playlists”. All images should be downloadable for use in presentations and course packs. With the MedOne App, users should be able to download content to their mobile devices for offline use.
7. The Authorised Users of the LMBA Authorised Institution indicated in Part III herein, shall have the online access to the Licensed Materials of the online research database *MedOne Neurosurgery* from the 1 January 2026 till 31 December 2028 (with possibility to opt-out in case of no funding for 2027 and/or 2028), 24 hours per day, 7 days per week, including weekends and days-off, except short periods of technical maintenance and repairs service or other unexpected downtime about which, when they are known, the Publisher shall in advance inform the Authorized Users. If an interruption of the access and use of the Licensed Material lasts for more than 5 consecutive days (after the LMBA has notified the Supplier about the lost access), the Supplier shall pay the LMBA a fine equalling to 0.02 percent of the Fee for each delayed day starting with the sixth delayed day after the notification to the Supplier. No fine will be paid for the accumulating periods of non-continuous interruptions or any interruption caused by any negligence or wilful misconduct by the LMBA or any Authorised Institution or Authorised User.
8. Upon coming into effect of the Licence Agreement, a Uniform Resource Locator (URL), as well as all other information deemed necessary for the availability of the access to this research database *MedOne Neurosurgery* shall be sent to the Manager of Databases by the e-mail indicated in Item 2 herein.
9. The Supplier shall make available to the Authorized Institution usage statistics on at least a quarterly basis.

III. Authorised Institution

10. The online access, including the remote access by the Authorised Users, to the Licensed Materials of the online research database *MedOne Neurosurgery* shall be given to the unlimited number of the concurrent Authorised Users and via the IP addresses of 1 (one) Authorised Institution – member of the LMBA set forth in the below Table:

11. Any of the IP addresses indicated in Item 10 herein can be adjusted. The Supplier shall be informed about the adjusted IP address by the Manager of Databases by e-mail by specifying the date of the adjustment of the IP addresses and providing for a time period of at least three business days to make the relevant technical modifications for assuring the access to the Licensed Material at the newly provided IP addresses. Should the IP addresses be adjusted prior to concluding the License Agreement, the new valid IP addresses of the Authorised Institution shall be entered into the Licence Agreement.
