GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SALE EUROSATORY 2026

Preamble

Each Party acknowledges that these General Terms and Conditions of Sale (hereinafter "Terms") have been the subject of an exchange within the framework of a mutually agreed contract, not an adhesion contract.

1. FIELD OF APPLICATION

1.1 Scope

The Exhibition is organised by COGES (Commissariat Général aux Expositions et aux Salons du GICAT) (hereinafter "the Organiser"), a French simplified joint-stock company with capital of €1,000,000, located at 39 rue Mstislav Rostropovitch, 75017 Paris, France, and entered in the Paris Trade and Companies Register under number 403 070 949. All correspondence must be sent to COGES - 39 rue Mstislav Rostropovitch, 75017 Paris - France.

These Terms govern the relationship between the Organiser and any professional exhibitor (hereinafter the "Exhibitor" or "Exhibitors") wishing to participate in Eurosatory 2026 (hereinafter the "Exhibition").

When completing its application and the order form online on the Exhibition's website, the Exhibitor is invited to read and expressly accept the Terms.

The Terms are accessible and available on each Exhibitor's extranet. No general terms of purchase or special conditions of the Exhibitor may, unless accepted in writing by the Organiser, take precedence over these conditions.

In the absence of a written acceptance by the Organiser, any general or specific terms binding the Exhibitor with any third party shall be unenforceable against it, regardless of when it may have been brought to its attention.

These Terms have been drawn up in accordance with the principle of transparency that governs the relations between the Organiser and the Exhibitor and form the basis for negotiations between the Parties and the framework of their commercial relationship, pursuant to the provisions of Article L.441-1 of the French Commercial Code.

1.2 Entry into force

The contract, of which the present Terms, the order form and the contractual documentation listed in Article 2 (hereinafter the "Contractual Documentation") form part, is formed and comes into force at the time of acceptance of the order form by the Organiser (hereinafter the "Contract").

Acceptance of the order form implies acceptance of the rates and price list corresponding to the services chosen by the Exhibitor, as well as the Terms and the Contractual Documentation.

The Terms applicable between the Organiser and the Exhibitor are

the Terms expressly accepted by the Exhibitor at the time of sending its application and order form.

The Organiser nevertheless remains entitled to modify the Terms at any time during the marketing period of the Exhibition, without this affecting the Contract already formed between the Organiser and the Exhibitor.

Under no circumstances may the present Contract be interpreted as being governed by the provisions of the Civil Code and/or the Commercial Code relating to civil or commercial leases.

In the event of any contradiction or difference of interpretation between several translations of these Terms, the French version shall prevail.

2. CONTRACTUAL DOCUMENTATION

When sending its application and order form, the Exhibitor declares having received from the Organiser the elements listed below or the Internet links to the elements listed below constituting the Contractual Documentation, that it has read them and accepts them without reservation and in the following order of priority, namely :

- The order form;
- The special conditions agreed between the Organiser and the Exhibitor;
- The Terms ;
- The provisions of the 2026 Exhibitor Manual when it becomes available on each Exhibitor's extranet;
- The legislation and regulations applicable in France, in particular :
 - those concerning Trade Fairs and Exhibitions held in France;
 - those relating to labor law and, in particular, the employment of foreign workers;
- Health and Safety rules, the provisions of the General Coordination Plan for Safety and Health Protection (PGCSPS) Suppliers;
- The access control measures implemented for secure areas of the Exhibition, facility surveillance and guarding of installations and security measures for equipment displayed;
- The Exhibitor Safety Notice, as well as any notes or regulations concerning the safety on the assembly and dismantling site, available in the Exhibitor Manual;
- The rules relating to stand construction and specific provisions concerning floor space and ground area;
- The measures to limit and compensate for environmental impact, in particular through reduction (reuse of packaging and certain construction and decoration materials) and management of site waste (sorting selective collection);
- The temporary use of radio frequencies;
- The obligation to register in the Exhibition Catalogue produced by the Organiser, a service included in the participation package.

3. THE EXHIBITION

3.1 Dates, venue and times

The Exhibition will take place from **June 15 to 19, 2026** at the Parc

des Expositions de Paris Nord Villepinte at the times specified in the Exhibitor Manual.

3.2 Conditions for visitors to access the Exhibition

The Exhibition is reserved for professionals.

Visitors are admitted only by invitation or unsolicited registration validated by the Organiser, and on presentation of proof of identity. Access to the Exhibition is not permitted to minors under the age of 16.

3.3 Cancellation, postponement, interruption for "Force Majeure" or any "Other Legitimate Event"

3.3.1 General provisions

Organizing an event involves several phases (preparation, execution) and several cost items (marketing, communication, location, event engineering, safety and security, sales administration). Throughout the event preparation process, the Organiser incurs expenses. As a result, the Organiser requests advance payments from Exhibitors, in the form of deposits/balances to be paid in instalments before the event opens.

The Parties expressly agree that the Organiser may, at any time, under the conditions specified below, cancel, postpone the Exhibition, or modify its dates, locations or duration, or interrupt its holding, in case of "Force Majeure" or for an "Other Legitimate Event" according to the terms defined below, whether in its entirety or with respect to one or more Exhibitors.

The Organiser and the Exhibitor have agreed to mutualize the risk related to the cancellation, postponement or interruption of the Exhibition in its entirety due to "Force Majeure" or "Other Legitimate Event" according to the terms defined below, between the various parties and under the conditions set out below.

By participating in the Exhibition, the Exhibitor expressly acknowledges that it subscribes to this choice and accepts to bear its share of the risk in the event of cancellation, postponement or interruption of the Exhibition, as set out below.

3.3.2 Definition

s Force Majeure

It is expressly agreed between the Parties that a case of "Force Majeure" justifying, at any time, the cancellation, postponement or interruption of the Exhibition, whether in its entirety or with regard to one or more Exhibitors, constitutes any case qualified as such pursuant to Article 1218 of the French Civil Code and by current case law. In particular, but without limitation, the following situations are considered to be cases of Force Majeure:

- any administrative, legislative, jurisdictional or equivalent decision, any sanitary, weather-related, economic, political or social situation, or any risk relating to the safety of goods or persons taking part in the Exhibition, at a local, national or international level, which could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time of launching the marketing of the Exhibition, beyond the Organiser's control and which make it impossible to organize, assemble, open or hold the Exhibition, or which entail

risks of disturbances or disorders likely to prevent the organization and/or proper running of the Exhibition, the effects of which cannot be avoided by appropriate measures;

- any decree declaring a state of emergency, or a state of health emergency, any ministerial, prefectural or municipal order (or any equivalent administrative measure), in particular one prohibiting the gathering of a number of people lower than the Exhibition's capacity;
- any administrative, legislative, jurisdictional or equivalent decisions issued by the French State, the European Union, a third State or an international organization that the French authorities (for decisions not issued by them) must respect, preventing either the participation of one or more Exhibitors at the Exhibition, or the presentation of certain equipment at the Exhibition;
- any prohibition or refusal of authorization by French and/or European authorities.

Other Legitimate Event

Constitute an "Other Legitimate Event" : any technical, economic, political, social, health or other reason, or on the basis of the principle of precautionary, leading the Organiser to consider that the conditions are not met to organize, assemble, open or hold the Exhibition under the conditions initially planned, whether in its entirety or with regard to one or more Exhibitors, without this decision falling within the scope of Article 1218 of the Civil Code or meeting the conditions of unforeseeability, externality and irresistibility, and even in the absence of an administrative ban on assembly.

This would be the case, but not limited to, in the following non-exhaustive circumstances: weather conditions, epidemic or any other health risk, armed conflict, revolt, boycott (political, consumer or other), risk of terrorist attack, strike or industrial action (general, sectoral or directed against the Exhibition), interruption, even partial, of local, regional, national or international means of transport or accommodation, impossibility or major difficulty for Exhibitors and/or visitors and/or service providers retained for the organization of the Exhibition (or some of them) to access the Exhibition space, or, due to one of these circumstances, insufficient Exhibitor numbers to achieve the financial equilibrium of the Exhibition and/or its commercial representativeness.

3.3.3 Cancellation of the entire Exhibition due to Force Majeure or Other Legitimate Event

The Parties expressly agree that the Organiser may cancel the Exhibition in its entirety in the event of Force Majeure or Other Legitimate Event, at any time prior to opening to visitors.

The Contract is then automatically terminated, and the Parties are released from their respective obligations.

The Exhibitor shall not be entitled to any reimbursement of sums paid, which shall be retained in full by the Organiser, subject to the reservation set out below.

In application of the spirit of risk mutualization set out above (cf. Article 3.3.1 above), the Parties expressly agree that after deduction by the Organiser of the direct and indirect costs it has already incurred for the organization and holding of the Exhibition, the available balance of the deposits and payments already made by the



Exhibitors will be distributed among these same Exhibitors in proportion to the payments made, to the exclusion of any reimbursement of sums already paid or any due compensation or indemnity on any grounds whatsoever.

The Exhibitor undertakes not to exercise any recourse against the Organiser as a result of the application of this Article. In particular, the Exhibitor undertakes not to seek the Organiser's liability in order to obtain compensation for any direct or indirect, material or immaterial loss, including operating losses.

3.3.4 Postponement of the entire Exhibition due to Force Majeure or Other Legitimate Event

The Parties expressly agree that the Organiser may postpone the entire Exhibition in the event of Force Majeure or Other Legitimate Event, at any time prior to opening to visitors.

The Organiser shall inform the Exhibitors as soon as possible of the new arrangements for the organization of the Exhibition.

The Exhibitor may not refuse the postponement.

In the event of postponement, the amounts already paid by the Exhibitor will be retained by the Organiser and the Contract will continue to be in full force and effect for the new dates of the Exhibition, without the Exhibitor being able to claim any compensation or indemnity (material or immaterial damage, direct or indirect, including operating losses) for any reason whatsoever.

The Exhibitor undertakes not to exercise any recourse against the Organiser due to the postponement of the Exhibition for Force Majeure or Other Legitimate Event.

3.3.5 Interruption of the entire Exhibition due to Force Majeure or Other Legitimate Event

In the event of a "temporary" interruption of the entire Exhibition due to Force Majeure or Other Legitimate Event after it has already begun, the Parties expressly agree to apply the provisions of **paragraph 2 of Article 1218 of the French Civil Code** relating to **temporary impediment, and to suspend the performance of the obligations of the Parties affected by this impediment.**

The contract shall then be temporarily suspended, and the Exhibitor shall not be entitled to any reimbursement of sums already paid or yet to be paid in respect of its participation in the Exhibition, which will be retained in full by the Organiser. It is expressly accepted and acknowledged by the Exhibitor that this provision is justified in particular by the fact that almost all the organizational costs will have already been incurred by the Organiser by the date on which the Exhibition would have begun.

In the event of a "definitive" interruption of the entire Exhibition due to Force Majeure or Other Legitimate Event after the Exhibition has already begun, the Parties shall be released from their obligations affected by the definitive interruption of the Exhibition. The Exhibitor shall not be entitled to any reimbursement, total or partial, of sums already paid in respect of its participation in the Exhibition, which will be retained in full by the Organiser.

It is expressly accepted and acknowledged by the Exhibitor that this

provision is justified by the fact that almost all of the organizational costs will have already been incurred by the Organiser by the date on which the Exhibition would have begun.

The Exhibitor undertakes not to exercise any recourse against the Organiser as a result of the application of this Article. In particular, the Exhibitor undertakes not to seek the Organiser's liability in order to obtain compensation for any direct or indirect, material or immaterial loss, including operating losses.

3.3.6 Cancellation, postponement, interruption of the Exhibition with regard to one or more Exhibitors due to Force Majeure or any Other Legitimate Event

In the event of cancellation, postponement or interruption of the Exhibition in respect of one or more Exhibitors due to Force Majeure or Other Legitimate Event, the sums already paid by the Exhibitor(s) concerned shall be retained in full by the Organiser.

The Exhibitor(s) concerned shall not be entitled to any reimbursement of sums already paid or still to be paid in respect of their participation in the Exhibition, which will be retained in full by the Organiser.

The Exhibitor(s) undertake(s) not to exercise any recourse against the Organiser as a result of the application of this Article. In particular, the Exhibitor undertakes not to seek the Organiser's liability in order to obtain compensation for any direct or indirect, material or immaterial loss, including operating losses.

3.4 Exclusions of one or more Exhibitors for fault

In the event of an Exhibitor's failure to comply with any of its contractual obligations (in particular Article 4 "Conditions of Exhibitor Participation and Control" and Article 18 "Compliance") or legal or regulatory, the Organiser may immediately exclude the Exhibitor and terminate the Contract in accordance with the terms specified below in Article 9.2.

4. CONDITIONS OF EXHIBITOR PARTICIPATION AND CONTROL

The admission of companies and the presentation of equipment at the Exhibition are subject to the control of the Organiser, whose aim is to particularly verify the compliance of Exhibitors, Co-Exhibitors and the products and equipment presented therein with the Trade Fairs and Exhibitions Regulations and the French regulations in general (labor law, foreign labor, worksite safety, waste management, use of frequencies).

The Exhibitor must meet the following cumulative criteria:

- be a company or an entity with legal personality, or dependent on a sovereign state,
- be headquartered in a country recognized by the international community and not subject to an embargo on Defense or Security equipment,
- operate in at least one of the countries eligible to exhibit, as an assembler, equipment manufacturer, systems integrator, subcontractor, supplier or service company, in one or more activities relating to land and air-land Defense and/or Security, as defined hereinafter:
 - ✓ design, development, production, maintenance, renovation, modernization, use and implementation of

- equipment and its environment;
- ✓ production and transformation of materials, tools and equipment;
- ✓ development of specific high-tech applications, products or skills;
- ✓ equipping, training and supporting user personnel;
- ✓ providing services or consulting for promotion, sales, financing, exports and cooperation (particularly agencies, institutions, offices and organizations officially recognized by the governments of countries admitted to exhibit);
- ✓ publishing Defense and Security documentations, magazines, catalogues, websites and directories.

Agents or intermediaries not officially recognized by one of the countries admitted to exhibit, as specified above, are excluded.

The admission of companies or organizations whose head office is located in a country under embargo by the United Nations (UN), the European Union (EU) or the French authorities is subject to a specific decision depending on the nature and scope of the embargo.

The Organiser reserves the right to admit or refuse, as a last resort, companies or organizations wishing to exhibit, without compensation.

The Organiser cannot be held responsible for decisions made by government authorities (e.g. Customs) relating to the export or import of equipment from any country whatsoever. It is the Exhibitor's responsibility to take all necessary steps to anticipate such decisions.

The products

The equipment and products offered must meet the following requirements:

- their nature or effects to the commitments made by France;
- and fall within the scope of one of the sections of the classifications of products and services, as detailed in the Exhibitor Manual: Exhibition regulations and on the Exhibition website : www.eurosatory.com/exposer.

The services, advice or documentation must relate to the fields of Defense or Security.

No real ammunition may be displayed at the Exhibition.

Control and verification

Immediately before the start of the Exhibition, the Organiser and the French Ministry of the Armed Forces shall check that companies as well as exhibited equipment, products, or services comply with the regulations defined. During that inspection, each person responsible for a stand, or their qualified representative, must be present at the Exhibition space.

An Exhibitor that is forbidden from exhibiting all or part of its equipment or products may neither hold the Organiser liable nor claim any compensation of any kind as specified in Article 3.4.

5. EXHIBITOR AND CO-EXHIBITOR STATUS

A company or organization wishing to present its equipment and

products at the Exhibition may do so under one of two statuses: that of Exhibitor or that of co-exhibitor (hereinafter referred to as the "Co-Exhibitor").

The Exhibitor is allocated an exhibition space by the Organiser and also pays various participation fees in connection with its order form.

The Exhibitor is authorised to host in its space, as Co-Exhibitor(s), one or more other companies or organisations of which the activity meets the Exhibition admission criteria set out in Article 4, subject to have registered the Co-Exhibitor with the Organiser, and to the registered Co-Exhibitors complying with the conditions of exhibiting at the Exhibition and with the Contract.

Exhibitors retain their Exhibitor status when they are gathered under the banner of a national or regional pavilion.

- In the case of an exhibition held under the banner of a national pavilion, the Exhibitor must be of the same nationality as the pavilion, as justified by the head office address of the latter.
- In the case of an exhibition held under the banner of a regional pavilion, the Exhibitor must be from the same region as the pavilion, as justified by the head office address of the latter.

The Co-Exhibitor does not have their own stand. It presents its equipment, products or any other promotional support on a surface made available to it by an Exhibitor on its stand.

Each Co-Exhibitor undertakes to sign the Terms. Thus, each Co-Exhibitor expressly and unequivocally undertakes to comply with the provisions of the Terms that concerns it, in particular the provisions of this Article 5, Article 8 relating to the space management, Article 9 relating to termination, Article 12 relating to intellectual property and image rights, Article 13 relating to its consent to the collection and processing of personal data, and Article 15 relating to complaints.

Each Co-Exhibitor also undertakes to take out all customary insurance policies in respect of the risks incurred during its participation in the Exhibition. As set out in Article 10.2, the insurance policies taken out by the Organiser do not under any circumstances cover either the liability of the Exhibitor and/or the Co-Exhibitor, or their equipment.

The Exhibitor guarantees the Organiser that each of its Co-Exhibitors will comply with the Terms and with all the obligations that it has itself subscribed to as a result of its participation in the Exhibition, in particular the provisions of this Article 5, Article 8 relating to the space management, Article 9 relating to termination, Article 12 relating to intellectual property and image rights, Article 13 relating to personal data, and Article 15 relating to complaints. Consequently, the Exhibitor will indemnify the Organiser for any loss that may be directly or indirectly related to the Co-Exhibitors' failure to comply with these obligations and the Terms.

As a Co-Exhibitor, the latter has no recourse or rights against the Organiser, notably in the event of cancellation, postponement, interruption for "Force Majeure" or any "Other Legitimate Event" as provided for in Article 3.3, or in the event of the exclusion of one or more Exhibitors or Co-Exhibitors for Fault as provided for in

Article 3.4 and/or Article 9.2, or in the event of termination of the Contract at the Exhibitor's initiative as provided for in Article 9.1. The Exhibitor undertakes to ensure that each of its Co-Exhibitors has at least one person permanently present at the stand, wearing a badge bearing the name of its company or organization, to present its equipment and products.

The host Exhibitor shall be responsible for the admission formalities and payment of participation fees for its Co-Exhibitor(s).

The Exhibitor is responsible for the entirety of its stand and undertakes not to host a Co-Exhibitor at its stand without having previously registered it with the Organiser. The Organiser reserves the right to invoice the Exhibitor for participation fees relating to non-registered Co-Exhibitors, without prejudice to the possibility of requesting their exclusion as stipulated below in Article 8.

6. PARTICIPATION AND PAYMENT FORMALITIES

The deadline for applications and placing orders is October 31, 2025.

The Organiser reserves the right, without any obligation on its part, to accept an application after October 31, 2025, subject to the availability of spaces or stand types.

The Exhibitor undertakes to comply with the registration and payment conditions set out below.

The process is as follows:

A company or organisation that has not exhibited at Eurosatory during one of the Exhibition's two previous editions (2022, 2024)

- Applies as an Exhibitor on the Exhibition's website (www.eurosatory.com) (online form), enclosing a copy of the company's registration certificate (for companies) or any other equivalent document (for other organizations) indicating its address, and a copy of the stand manager's passport. The Organiser examines the application, makes a final decision and, as applicable, allocates login details to the company or organization.
- The company or organization uses its login details to complete and submit the order form online.
- Upon receipt of the online order form, an automatic acknowledgement of receipt is sent by the Organiser with a summary of the order that includes an express invitation to click on a hypertext link to electronically sign the Terms.
- The signing of the Terms does not automatically entail definitive admission of the Exhibitor by the Organiser.
- After acceptance of the Terms by the company or organization, the Organiser issues and sends (the date of dispatch being taken as proof) a deposit invoice for 50% of the total order amount including VAT, which the Exhibitor undertakes to pay on receipt (with application of the VAT in accordance with regulations), online or by any other means at its disposal (bank transfer, cheque);
- Receipt of this deposit by the Organiser constitutes the prerequisite for the dispatch of a space proposal in accordance with the terms specified below in Article 8. If the deposit is not paid within ten (10) working days of the date of dispatch of the deposit invoice, the Organiser may invoke the provisions of Article 9.2 below. A company or organisation that has already

exhibited at one of Eurosatory's two previous editions is not required to make that request to participate and will automatically receive, at its request, its login details.

- The company or organization uses its login details to complete and submit the order form online.
- Upon receipt of the online order form, an automatic acknowledgement of receipt is sent by the Organiser with a summary of the order that includes an express invitation to click on a hypertext link to electronically sign the Terms.
- The signing of the Terms does not automatically entail definitive admission of the Exhibitor by the Organiser.
- After acceptance of the Terms by the company or organization, the Organiser issues and sends (the date of dispatch being taken as proof) a deposit invoice for 50% of the total order amount including VAT, which the Exhibitor undertakes to pay on receipt (with application of the VAT in accordance with regulations), online or by any other means at its disposal (bank transfer, cheque);
- Receipt of this deposit by the Organiser constitutes the prerequisite for the dispatch of a space proposal in accordance with the terms specified below in Article 8. If the deposit is not paid within ten (10) working days of the date of dispatch of the deposit invoice, the Organiser may invoke the provisions of Article 9.2 below.

Payment of the balance of the participation fee

Deadline for payment of the balance: **no later than January 31, 2026.**

From February 1st 2026, any order must be paid in full, i.e. the total amount including VAT, in accordance with the invoice sent by the Organiser and with the Terms.

Failure by an Exhibitor to pay the balance by the contractual date may result in the termination of the Contract, for which the Exhibitor is responsible.

The Organiser shall retain all amounts already received by way of lump-sum indemnity in full discharge for the loss sustained by it, as a result of the termination.

The Exhibitor acknowledges that it is obliged to pay the balance in full without necessarily knowing the specific final description of its space and/or of its stand.

Security deposit - inventory

Each Exhibitor having taken a bare space inside and/or outside a hall must carry out an entry and exit inventory with an authorised member of staff of the Exhibition's technical office. The Exhibitor may be represented in the inventory process by its designer, in which case the latter engages the responsibility of the Exhibitor. The inventory document shall be signed upon entry and exit by the Exhibitor or its representative. Any Exhibitor setting in its space without attending the entry inventory shall be denied access to its stand as soon as that breach is noted.

Before drawing up the entry inventory, the person responsible for the stand who is present (Exhibitor, designer, or the person appointed by the Exhibitor) must pay a security deposit. After payment of the security deposit, the Exhibitor will be given a receipt with a specific number, which must be retained in order to recover

the security deposit at the time of the exit inventory.

This security deposit shall be returned after the exit inventory has been done jointly by an authorised member of the technical office and by the Exhibitor or its authorised representative (whether or not any damage or waste is found). To do this, the person concerned must present the receipt that it was given when the security deposit was paid.

If the Exhibitor or its authorised representative does not attend, its absence shall be mentioned in the exit inventory, which can be enforced against the Exhibitor, and the security deposit shall be retained by the Organiser until the Exhibitor signs the exit inventory. If the Exhibitor does not sign this exit inventory within ten (10) working days of it being completed, the security deposit shall pass to the Organiser, which shall retain it permanently.

If any damage or waste is found at the time of the exit inventory, the cost of repair being at the Exhibitor's expense will be deducted from the security deposit, and the balance shall be returned or invoiced to the Exhibitor.

The amount of the inventory of fixtures deposit is:

- 500 euros for a space of less than 50m² ;
- 1 000 euros for a space between 51m² and 250m² ;
- 2 000 euros for a space over 250m² ;
- 1 000 euros for an outdoor pavilion.

The security deposit must be paid by credit card (VISA, MASTERCARD or AMEX) or by cheque to the technical office. Cash is not accepted. The cheque will only be cashed in the event of any damage noted during the exit inventory procedure, or if the Exhibitor fails to sign the exit inventory report within ten (10) working days of it being completed.

7. PARTICIPATION FEES

The participation fees invoiced to the Exhibitor by the Organiser for its participation and that of its Co-Exhibitors include a certain number of services presented the commercial documents.

8. SPACE MANAGEMENT

8.1 Space allocation

The Organiser remains free to determine the allocation of spaces. Spaces are allocated taking into account the general layout of the Exhibition, local requirements, surface areas requested, the type of equipment to be exhibited and, as far as possible, any wishes expressed by the Exhibitor, taken into consideration in the order of arrival of registrations accompanied by payment.

The Exhibitor will be required to validate the proposed space under the conditions specified on the plan (PDF version including a deadline for making the space available).

In any case, the Exhibitor will only receive confirmation of the allocation of its space after payment of the full amount (including VAT) of its participation, due no later than January 31, 2026. The Exhibitor is required to comply with technical procedures and

undertakes to provide, within the deadlines specified in the order forms, all elements (construction project, signs, etc.) necessary for the final validation of its technical specifications.

The Organiser reserves the right, until June 15, 2026, to modify the initial allocation and to change the location of the space already allocated or to modify its dimensions, up to a limit of 5% without any change in invoicing, and without the Exhibitor being able to request the cancellation of its participation or a reduction in its invoicing. The Organiser cannot be held responsible for any differences that may arise (as a result of the layout of the space or new easements) between the dimensions Exhibition on the plans and the space(s) actually made available to the Exhibitor.

Any such changes subsequent to the signing of the Contract will be made within the framework of a dialogue between the Organiser and the Exhibitor.

The presence of an Exhibitor at a previous Eurosatory Exhibition does not constitute a preference criterion and does not give rise to any particular right to the allocation, surface, location or configuration of a space.

8.2 Use of Space

It is forbidden for an Exhibitor to assign or sublet all or part of the allocated space (except to its duly registered Co-Exhibitor(s)) without the prior written consent of the Organiser.

Under no circumstances may an Exhibitor or Co-Exhibitor use the space allocated to them to advertise in any form whatsoever for companies or organizations not registered as Co-Exhibitors at the Exhibition.

Should an Exhibitor host on its stand a company or an organization not registered as a Co-Exhibitor, the latter may be subject to immediate exclusion without compensation and without prejudice to the other rights and remedies of the Organiser and with the Exhibitor at fault being invoiced for its participation in the Exhibition, the participation fee being retained by the Organiser even if the Co-Exhibitor concerned is expelled.

9. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

9.1 At the Exhibitor's initiative

It is agreed that in the event of the Exhibitor's withdrawal, the Contract shall be terminated.

The Exhibitor must send its request for termination by registered letter with acknowledgement of receipt, accompanied, if applicable, by supporting documents.

The Organiser shall be entitled to compensation as defined below, even if the space is reallocated by the Organiser to another Exhibitor after termination:

- 25% of the total amount of the order including VAT shall be due in the event of termination notified between June 30, 2025 and October 31, 2025;
- 50% of the total amount of the order including VAT shall be due in the event of termination notified between November 1, 2025 and January 31, 2026.

In the event of termination notified on or after February 1, 2026, the full amount of the order, including VAT, shall be retained by the Organiser.

The Co-Exhibitor may not claim any compensation from the Organiser in the event termination by the Exhibitor.

Any termination and/or claim by a Co-Exhibitor may under no circumstances be asserted against the Organiser, the Exhibitor being the sole co-contractor of the Organiser.

9.2 At the Organiser's initiative

In the event that the Exhibitor breaches any of its contractual obligations or any legal or regulatory provisions, or in the event that the Organiser becomes aware of new information which, had it been known at the outset, would have motivated the rejection of its admission (the "Termination for Fault"), the Organiser may terminate the Contract by giving the Exhibitor written notice and where such notice remains unanswered for ten (10) days, a period that can be reduced taking into account the Exhibition's opening date and/or the circumstances of the Exhibitor's participation. Thus, if the Exhibition is in progress, termination may be accompanied by exclusion of the Exhibitor.

This termination will also result in the Co-Exhibitors being unable to exhibit without any recourse on their part against the Organiser.

In the event of Termination for Fault, the Exhibitor undertakes not to exercise any recourse against the Organiser as a result of the application of this provision and may not claim any reimbursement of sums paid, which will be retained in full by the Organiser. The Exhibitor shall remain liable to pay the Organiser the full amount of its participation in the Exhibition, without prejudice to any damages and interest to which the Organiser may be entitled as a result of this Termination for Fault.

10. INSURANCE

10.1 Exhibitor's insurance

It is the Exhibitor's responsibility to take out all customary insurance policies required to cover the risks incurred for its participation in the Exhibition, including in particular:

✓ Civil liability insurance

A Civil Liability contract covering its presence and participation at the Exhibition, to cover bodily injury, property damage and consequential loss that it and the persons for whom it is responsible may cause to any natural or legal person present on site, and in particular during dynamic and static presentations.

On a case-by-case basis, the Organiser may ask the Exhibitor for proof of insurance.

The Organiser declines all responsibility for any loss or damage that may be caused to the Exhibitor's samples, models or exhibition equipment, and in general to any of the Exhibitor's property, under its usage or its custody, for any reason whatsoever, and is not liable for any theft that may be committed.

✓ Equipment insurance

An All Equipment Risks contract covering the equipment belonging to it or placed under its custody.

✓ Cancellation insurance

A cancellation insurance contract covering its irrecoverable costs incurred in the event of cancellation or postponement of the Exhibition.

10.2 Organiser's insurance:

✓ Civil liability insurance

The Organiser has taken out a civil liability insurance policy to cover bodily injury, property damage and consequential loss that it and the persons for whom it is responsible may cause to any natural or legal person present on site. Under no circumstances does this insurance cover the Exhibitor's and/or the Co-Exhibitor's civil liability.

✓ Equipment insurance

The Organiser has taken out an All Equipment Risks insurance policy covering only its equipment and all its exterior and interior installations built by it for the Exhibition. Under no circumstances does this insurance cover the Exhibitor's and/or the Co-Exhibitor's equipment.

The Exhibitor/Co-Exhibitor wishing to obtain information on the insurance policies taken out by the Organiser may contact the firm indicated in the Exhibitor's Manual.

11. CUSTOMS - CONTROL OF SENSITIVE PRODUCTS - PROHIBITED PRODUCTS

11.1 Customs formalities

Each Exhibitor is responsible to complete the customs transit formalities for equipment and products arriving from abroad (temporary admission) - (see Exhibitor's Manual). Exhibitors from countries under embargo should note that administrative decisions (Customs Directorate) may jeopardise their participation in the Exhibition. The Exhibitor must take all necessary steps for the import and reexport of its equipment in respect of all countries of transit. The Organiser shall not be held liable for any difficulties that may arise in accomplishing these formalities.

The Organiser may not be held liable by the Exhibitor if prohibitions or refusals of authorization by government authorities prevent either its participation in the Exhibition or the presentation some of its equipment.

Therefore, in such cases, the Exhibitor is required to pay by way of indemnity, including in the event of re-letting, 100% of the amount of its order (including VAT), without prejudice to any additional damages that may be claimed against it.

The Exhibition Eurosatory 2026 scrupulously respects the commitments made by France to date concerning embargoes decided by the United Nations and the European Union, or concerning weapons or technologies banned or restricted by the international community.

11.2 Control of sensitive products

France rigorously applies European export control regulations to arms exhibitions. All Exhibitors are therefore equally subject to these regulations.

The display at the Eurosatory Exhibition of certain controlled products may require export control formalities in addition to customs formalities.

Exhibited products are presumed to enter French territory **from the exhibiting company's country of origin**, and at the end of Eurosatory 2026, to leave France bound **for that same country**. If this is not the case, please inform the Organiser sensitive-goods-control@eurosatory.com

Any questions concerning the control of equipment, services and/or information should be addressed to sensitive-goods-control@eurosatory.com

11.3 Prohibited products

Prohibited products include, but are not limited to, the following, which may not be presented in any form whatsoever (including mock-ups or documents of any kind):

Anti-personnel mines: under the Convention on the Prohibition of the Use, Stockpiling, Production and Transfer of Anti-Personnel Mines and on their Destruction, known as the Ottawa Agreement of September 18, 1997, which has been signed and notified by France (law no. 98.564 of July 8, 1998, repealed and incorporated into the French Defense Code).

Incapacitating lasers: under the Geneva Convention of October 10, 1980 on the Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons : Protocol IV on blinding laser weapons, Vienna 10/10/1995, implemented by France in 1998 (Decree no. 2002-123 of 01/25/2002).

Cluster munition: following the entry into force on August 1, 2010 of the international convention prohibiting the use, production, stockpiling, acquisition and transfer of this category of weapons (signed by France on December 3, 2008 in Oslo, Norway).

Goods which could be used for capital punishment, torture or other cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment, as designated by Annex II of Regulation (EU) 2019/125 of the European Parliament and of the Council of January 16, 2019 and codified by Decree No. 2020-831 of July 1st, 2020 on trade in certain goods governed by the said Regulation.

The Organiser will warn Exhibitors from countries under embargo or restrictions, or who intend to exhibit prohibited equipment. It is the responsibility of the Exhibitors concerned to comply with the various regulations. The Organiser is at the disposal of these Exhibitors in terms of information but cannot replace them.

12. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY AND IMAGE RIGHTS

The Exhibitor certifies to the Organiser that:

1. It is the owner of the intellectual property rights or, where applicable, have express authorisation to use the equipment,

products, creations, drawings, patents, models and trademarks that it exhibits during the Exhibition, and comply strictly with the legal and regulatory provisions in force.

2. It ensures that the goods and products on display, as well as any display, logo or advertising content, comply with all applicable laws and regulations, particularly those concerning consumer protection, intellectual property, fair competition and public health.

3. It acknowledges that the Organiser cannot be held responsible for the acts, failures or shortcomings of another exhibitor, and waive the right to hold the Organiser liable in this respect.

4. It guarantees the Organiser against any claim, recourse or action brought by third parties due to the use or display by the Exhibitor of equipment, products, brands or creations presented within the framework of the Exhibition.

5. It is informed that the Organiser may request the immediate withdrawal of any content or product that does not comply with these requirements, without this entitling the Exhibitor concerned to any compensation whatsoever.

The Exhibitor is informed and agrees that films and/or photographs will be taken on the Exhibition spaces. These films and/or photographs, in which the logos, brands and products presented by the Exhibitor may appear and may be used by the Organiser for the promotion of its events by any means whatsoever and on any medium whatsoever, with regard to customers, partners, prospective customers and any third party. Exhibitors who do not wish their logos, brands or products or those of their Co-Exhibitors to appear in films, photographs or documents promoting events organized by the Organiser must notify the Organiser in writing before the opening of the Exhibition.

Exhibitors or Co-Exhibitors wishing to take photographs at the Exhibition, other than of their own stand and equipment, must first inform the Organiser in writing. In this respect, the Exhibitor will be personally responsible for obtaining the necessary authorizations for taking photographs of the Exhibition and will be solely responsible for respecting the image rights of all Exhibitors, visitors and other Exhibition participants.

Exhibitors or Co-Exhibitors wishing to broadcast music or recorded sound on their stand must obtain the prior agreement of the Organiser and undertake not to disturb either their immediate neighbours or the running of the Exhibition. The Organiser is entitled to take all necessary measures to stop the disturbance.

The Exhibitor or Co-Exhibitor concerned guarantees to have made the necessary declarations to the SACEM and to ensure payment thereof - see Exhibitor's Manual.

The Exhibitor guarantees the Organiser against any recourse and/or claim(s) from any third party due to the non-fulfilment of its obligations or those of its Co-Exhibitors.

13. PERSONAL DATA

13.1 Data collection, Purpose of Processing and identity of the Data Controller

The Organiser collects and processes the personal data and information of the Exhibitor/Co-Exhibitor for the following purposes (hereinafter referred to together as the "Purpose of Processing"):

- To manage the order;
- To execute the Terms;
- To carry out operations relating to business development;
- To manage requests for access, rectification and objection rights;
- To manage unpaid invoices and disputes.

The Exhibitor/Co-Exhibitor's information and personal data are also processed for security purposes to comply with Organiser's legal and regulatory obligations to enable the Organiser to improve and personalise its services.

The Organiser acts as the Data Controller within meaning of the applicable laws and regulations.

The data collected by the Organiser is processed in a lawful, fair and transparent manner.

The data collected is adequate, relevant and limited to what is strictly necessary for the Purpose of Processing.

13.2 Data collection and consent

The Exhibitor/Co-Exhibitor expressly and unequivocally acknowledges that it has been informed that it has the right to withdraw its consent at any time.

The Exhibitor/Co-Exhibitor agrees expressly and unequivocally to communicate to the Organiser their last names, first names, postal address, email address, phone number, and bank card number.

13.3 Information and access to personal data

In accordance with the provisions of the EU General Data Protection Regulation 2016/679 and the French Data Protection Law of January 6, 1978 as amended, the Organiser, as Data Controller, provides the Exhibitor/Co-Exhibitor with the following information:

- a) The Exhibitor/Co-Exhibitor agrees that the personal data concerning it and collected by the Organiser within the framework of the present Contract may be transmitted to the service providers, sub-contractors and partners with whom it has a contractual relationship for the purposes of executing the Contract, receiving, via all channels, commercial proposals and news relating to the activity and services of the latter, provided that the latter (located in the European Union and outside the EU), recipients of the personal data, are subject to regulations guaranteeing an appropriate and adapted level of protection as defined in EU Regulation 2016/679. This information is kept by them or any company appointed for this purpose, under the legal and regulatory conditions.
- b) The Organiser, its partners, service providers and subcontractors will retain personal information and data for the maximum legal or regulatory period applicable according to the Purpose of Processing.
- c) The Exhibitor/Co-Exhibitor has a right of access, rectification,

deletion, limitation, portability and opposition to the data collected concerning it.

Thus, the data collected by the Organiser within the framework of the present may give rise to the exercise of the right of access and rectification under the conditions provided for by EU Regulation 2016/679. Any Exhibitor/Co-Exhibitor may at any time obtain a copy of the information concerning it by simple request to the Organiser and may transfer such information to another data controller. The Exhibitor/Co-Exhibitor may request the deletion or rectification of this information in writing to the above address. The Exhibitor/Co-Exhibitor may at any time object to receiving commercial offers, have their contact details modified, and object to the disclosure thereof by sending a notification by registered letter or by registered email with acknowledgement of receipt to: COGES 39 rue Mstislav Rostropovitch, 75017 Paris, France.

d) The Exhibitor/Co-Exhibitor has the right to lodge a complaint with a national supervisory authority.

e) The requirement to provide personal data is a condition of acceptance of these Terms. The Exhibitor/Co-Exhibitor is obliged to provide the aforementioned Data. Failure to do so will result in the Exhibitor's application being rejected.

14. UNFAIR COMPETITION

The Exhibitor expressly refrains from engaging in acts of unfair competition for the duration of the Exhibition, such as, but not limited to, any surveys conducted outside its stand, and/or any actions which could divert visitors from the Exhibition in its favour and to the detriment of the Organiser.

15. COMPLAINTS

The Organiser cannot be held liable for services provided directly by VIPARIS at the Paris Nord Villepinte Exhibition Centre: electricity, water, gas, compressed air, fluid discharge, telephone connections, Internet access, slings and hooks.

As regards the official evening reception of Eurosatory, an Exhibitor or Co-Exhibitor may not claim any compensation from the Organiser if this event is totally or partly cancelled whatever the reason for the cancellation.

Any complaint in connection with the Exhibition must be made by registered letter with acknowledgement of receipt requested within ten (10) days of the end of the Exhibition

16. VAT

16.1 General rules

French VAT is invoiced and payable by all Exhibitors, except in cases where European or international regulations provide for an exemption.

16.2 Exhibitors based in the European Union (EU)

Exhibitors established in the EU, outside France, must provide a valid intra-Community VAT number. In this case, invoicing will, in

principle, be carried out exclusive of VAT, in accordance with the European Directive 2006/112/EC on VAT and the customer's reverse charge mechanism.

16.3 Non-EU Exhibitors

For Exhibitors established outside the EU, VAT will not be charged on services sold by the Organiser in accordance with the applicable provisions.

16.4 Exhibitor's liability

Exhibitors are solely responsible for complying with their national VAT regulations.

It is the Exhibitor's responsibility to provide the information and documents required for the application or exemption of VAT.

In the event of non-communication or error in the information transmitted, VAT will be invoiced in accordance with the regulations in force and cannot be reimbursed by the Organiser.

No VAT claim may be made against the Organiser, which shall have no liability in this respect.

Should the French tax authorities call into question the VAT exemption applied to invoices issued by the Organiser to Exhibitors established outside France, the Organiser will immediately issue an amended invoice in order to pass on to the Exhibitor the French VAT due. This invoice must be paid within thirty (30) days of receipt by the Exhibitor.

17. WAIVER OF RECOURSE

Subject to any clause to the contrary arising from the laws and regulations in force, the Exhibitor expressly waives any recourse it may have against the Organiser (and the auxiliaries of any kind it calls upon), and any other Exhibitor for any direct or indirect damage the latter may cause to its property, equipment and fittings and to those of its employees, and for any operating losses and/or additional expenses whatever the cause, with the exception of Malicious Acts (*).

The Exhibitor undertakes to obtain the same waiver of recourse from its insurers.

By way of reciprocity and with the exception of Malicious Acts (*), and subject to any clause to the contrary arising from the laws and regulations in force, the Organiser and its insurer waive all recourse against the Exhibitor and its insurer for damage affecting the goods, equipment and fittings belonging to the Organiser and for which the Exhibitor is responsible.

The Exhibitor also undertakes to indemnify the aforementioned legal entities and individuals, i.e. the Organiser and its insurer, as well as any other Exhibitor, against any action or claim that may be brought against them in this context, by any interested party.

(*) A **Malicious Act** is one performed with the intention of causing harm.

18. COMPLIANCE

The Exhibitor must comply with all applicable legal provisions governing its activities, in particular and without limitation, the Sapin 2 law, the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act and the UK Bribery Act with regards to anti-bribery requirements.

The Exhibitor must obtain any permits or licenses required for these operations. The Exhibitor shall not take any action in violation of any applicable legal or regulatory provision that could result in the Organiser's liability.

19. DISPUTES RESOLUTION AND APPLICABLE LAW

19.1 Disputes resolution

Any dispute arising in connection with the present contract must be settled amicably by the parties (mediation, conciliation).

In the absence of an amicable resolution within thirty (30) days of the commencement of negotiations by the Parties, they agree to settle the dispute by arbitration.

All disputes arising out of or in connection with this contract shall be finally settled by arbitration under the auspices of the International Arbitration Chamber of Paris ("CAIP") (6, avenue Pierre 1^{er} de Serbie, 75116 PARIS, tel: 01.42.36.99.65, fax: 01.42.36.99.58), in accordance with its Rules, which the parties declare they are familiar with and accept. The Parties shall appoint a sole arbitrator by mutual agreement, from the list submitted by CAIP. Failing agreement between the Parties, the arbitrator will be appointed by the Commission in accordance with the CAIP Rules.

19.2 Applicable law

The Contract binding the Parties is governed by French law.
