

Project MUSE Journal Collection Institutional Subscriber License Agreement

This Institutional Subscriber Licensing Agreement for journal collections on Project MUSE is by and between

The Johns Hopkins University Press (“JHUP”), a division of the Johns Hopkins, whose registered office is at 2715 North Charles, Baltimore, MD 21218-3263, United States of America University and the creator, owner, and distributor of Project MUSE

and

Lithuanian Research Library Consortium (LMBA), whose registered office is at Saulėtekio al. 14, Vilnius, LT-10223, Lithuania (“**LMBA or Subscriber**”).

and

EBSCO Information Services GmbH, as Distributor for EBSCO Publishing Inc. whose registered office is at Volkmarstraße 18, 12099 Berlin, Germany (“**EBSCO**”) as sole authorized distributor of Project MUSE for the John Hopkins University Press (JHUP).

I. RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

A. Authorized Users

A subscription to a journal collection on Project MUSE grants unlimited access to the full text of the included journal title(s) for educational, research, and personal use by the faculty, staff, students, alumni, library patrons, and other Authorized Users of the Subscriber's campus/institutional network. Distance learners, alumni, and other off-campus affiliates may access Project MUSE if their internet access is through the campus network or via a secure proxy server.

Subscribers are expected to make their best feasible efforts to enable access to Project MUSE journals only to faculty, students, staff, alumni, and walk-in library patrons using

the campus' physical library facilities. There are no contractual limits on the number of Authorized Users from one campus at any given time.

B. Permitted

Provided that the copyright header attached to the article is retained, Authorized Users at the Subscriber's institution may

1. download and print one copy of each article for personal use and archive contents on their own personal computers
2. use an "offline browser" that allows downloading content from the site to be read later. The browser must be configured to request no more than one article per minute. Non-compliance with this rule will result in access to Project MUSE being blocked until the problem is resolved. If the problem is repeated, the offending IP may be permanently blocked from accessing the Project MUSE site.
3. transmit to a third-party colleague, in paper or electronically, reasonable amounts of the licensed materials for personal, scholarly, educational, scientific, or research uses, but in no case for resale
4. distribute a copy of individual articles or items of the licensed materials in print or electronic form to Authorized Users, including the distribution of a copy for noncommercial educational purposes, to each individual student (Authorized User) in a class at a Subscriber's institution
5. use a persistent URL, or durable URL, to the licensed materials, including full-text articles, for courses of instruction offered by the Subscribing Institution, where access is restricted to students enrolled in the course, to instructors, and to library staff maintaining the link, and such access is limited to the duration of the course. Each item should carry an appropriate acknowledgment of the source, copyright, and publisher, and the links to such items shall be deleted by the Subscriber when they are no longer required for such purpose.
6. fulfill requests from other libraries, a practice commonly called Interlibrary Loan. Licensee agrees to fulfill such requests in accordance with Sections 107 and 108 of the U.S. Copyright Act. Requests may be fulfilled using electronic, paper, or intermediate means.
7. place selected listings and notices on the campus network to inform users of availability
8. display, download or print the Licensed Materials for the purpose of internal marketing or testing or for training Authorized Users or groups of Authorized Users

9. subject to prior notification and approval by Project MUSE, engage in text processing, which is any kind of analysis of natural language text. MUSE will make appropriate arrangements prior to the start of this activity to account for usage data and ensure continued access for the user. This may include but not be limited to a process by which information may be derived from text by identifying patterns and trends within natural language through text categorization, statistical pattern recognition, concept or sentiment extraction, and the association of natural language with indexing terms. Technology will not be used to hinder any rights granted under this section.

C. Not Permitted

Authorized Users at the Subscriber's institution may not

1. disseminate content from Project MUSE outside the campus or institution by any means, except as noted above.
2. transmit the digital source code, whether plain ASCII or tagged
3. use contents and articles from Project MUSE in course packs offered for sale
4. systematically download content by robots or other automatic processes without explicit approval from JHUP
5. burden server(s) with activities, such as computer programs, that automatically download content, commonly known as web robots, spiders, crawlers, wanderers, or accelerators. If there is evidence that such unauthorized activities have taken place, the Subscriber will be contacted, and access to the offending IP address(es) may be shut down if a prompt resolution is not achieved. No refunds or credits will be given for time without access as a result of such activities.
6. remove, cover, overlay, obscure, block, or change any copyright notices, legends, or terms of use; or modify or create a derivative work of any Journal content without the prior written permission of the copyright holder
7. re-use content for commercial use without prior written permission of the copyright holder
8. make agreements for access to Project MUSE Journal content with individuals, organizations, vendors, affiliates, or partners, who are not Authorized Users.

If the Subscriber becomes aware of unauthorized access to Project MUSE, it will notify JHUP immediately and cooperate in locating and attempting to stop the specific

individuals who are abusing the service. If the specific abuser(s) cannot be identified or stopped, JHUP has the right to withhold, suspend, or terminate access to any or all licensed content, without liability.

II. COPYRIGHT AND PERMISSIONS

Unless otherwise noted, Publishers hold the copyright, both as a compilation and as individual articles, on all materials published in journals on Project MUSE, whether the material is in print or electronic form. All Journal content is subject to "fair use" provisions of U.S. or applicable international copyright laws (www.copyright.gov/fair-use/more-info.html). In the event of a dispute between a Publisher and any contributor with respect to the electronic distribution of any article on Project MUSE, JHUP shall have the right to remove such article, and will do so upon the Publisher's request.

III. ACCESS AND AUTHENTICATION

The Project MUSE file server permits entry by recognizing authorized IP addresses. Distance learners and alumni who access the internet via campus IP accounts or a secure proxy server may use Project MUSE, but direct access is not available through independent service providers. Referring URL is offered as an alternative method for remote access, so long as a secure system is in place allowing only Authorized Users, as described above, access to Project MUSE via the referring URL. Project MUSE also

supports access via Shibboleth authentication, and via email domain authentication utilizing a MyMUSE account.

At the time an order is placed, the Subscriber provides IP addresses for all institutional networks and computers that require access to MUSE content, as well as any relevant details for enabling access via referring URL, Shibboleth, or email domain.

The Subscriber will make reasonable efforts to create and maintain appropriate security measures to ensure that only Authorized Users can access subscribed content online. The Subscriber also affirms that all IP addresses provided for use of MUSE content are controlled by its institution exclusively for internet access by Authorized Users. Valid IP addresses must not include those of publicly accessible proxy or cache servers.

IV. USAGE STATISTICS

JHUP shall provide the Subscriber with COUNTER-compliant usage data (www.projectcounter.org) on the articles downloaded, by Journal title, on a monthly basis for private internal use by JHUP and the Subscriber only.

V. ARCHIVING

Approximately 90 days after the expiration of an annual subscription term, Project MUSE will provide the Subscriber, upon request, an archival (non-searchable) file on an external hard drive or other appropriate media as determined by Project MUSE, containing the content of all issues published online during the 12-month subscription term.

Subscribing Members may participate in the LOCKSS (Lots of Copies Keeps Stuff Safe) system for archiving digitized publications. To benefit from this support, Subscribing Members must install a LOCKSS cache at their institution. (See www.lockss.org for further information.) The Subscribing Member may perpetually use the LOCKSS system to archive and restore Journal content, so long as use is otherwise consistent with this Agreement. Journal content may be made available to other LOCKSS system Subscribing Members who indicate a right to the subscribed Journal content.

Project MUSE participates in PORTICO's E-Journal Preservation Service for the preservation of journal content on the MUSE platform. (See www.portico.org for further information.)

VI. ACCESSIBILITY COMPLIANCE

JHUP complies with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), by supporting assistive software or devices such as large print interfaces, text-to-speech output, voice-activated input, refreshable braille displays, and alternate keyboard or pointer interfaces, in a manner consistent with the Web Accessibility Initiative Web Content Accessibility Guidelines 2.0 AA (<http://www.w3.org/WAI/guid-tech.html>).

JHUP maintains an Accessibility web page, including downloadable copies of current Voluntary Product Accessibility Template (VPAT) documentation, at <https://muse.jhu.edu/accessibility>. JHUP shall ensure that product maintenance and upgrades are implemented in a manner that does not compromise product accessibility.

VII. SUBSCRIPTION TERMS

A. Subscription Activation and Invoicing

Subscriptions for institutions are activated for the term specified in Annex 1, covering the journals and fees listed therein, in accordance with the Tender for subscription services to the online research database Project Muse Journals dated October 22, 2025.).

No later than by 10 December 2025 EBSCO shall issue to LMBA the first invoice in the amount indicated in Item 3, Annex 1 as payable for the year 2026. If EBSCO fails to issue the invoice to LMBA at a fixed date, EBSCO shall lose his right to receive the payment and the Agreement shall be considered as terminated. In such case EBSCO shall lose its right to the reimbursement of any losses.

EBSCO shall submit other invoices on the dates agreed between the parties by email, no later than 3 months prior to the expiration date of the subscription period.

If the submission of the invoice on the agreed deadlines is overdue, it shall be considered that the EBSCO has refused to provide the service for that particular year and the Agreement shall be terminated. In such case the EBSCO shall lose his right to the reimbursement of any losses.

The fee of the Agreement shall be the price which has been quoted in the tender, and it shall be paid by Subscriber within 60 days from the date of the invoice issued by EBSCO to Subscriber.

VIII. ADDITIONAL TERMS

If any provision or provisions of this License shall be held to be invalid, illegal, unenforceable, or in conflict with the law of any jurisdiction, the validity, legality, and enforceability of the remaining provisions shall not be in any way affected or impaired thereby.

JHUP will not be held liable for any delays, inaccuracies, errors or omissions in Project MUSE, in the transmission or delivery of all or any part thereof, or for any damages arising from any of the foregoing. JHUP does not represent or endorse the accuracy or reliability of any content.

If the Subscriber becomes aware of infractions upon this Agreement, it shall report these to Project MUSE immediately. This Agreement may not be assigned and represents the complete understanding as to the subject matter therein.

If the Subscriber becomes aware of infractions upon this Agreement, it shall report these to JHUP and EBSCO immediately. This Agreement may not be assigned and represents the complete understanding as to the subject matter therein.

The parties acknowledge that any amendments to this Agreement shall be subject to the requirements set forth in Article 89 of the Law on Public Procurement of the Republic of Lithuania. If, during the performance of the License Agreement, the legal acts regulating the payment of VAT change in a way that directly affects the Fee, the Fee including VAT shall be recalculated according to the law without changing the Fee excluding VAT. The recalculated Fee shall be formalized by an amendment and applied from the date the new VAT rate enters into force and must be applicable. If the VAT rate increases and the Institution has no available funding to cover the increased cost, the financing period shall be adjusted accordingly, or the Agreement shall be terminated, with a pro rata refund provided for the unused portion of the subscription period.

A member of the Licensee's consortium may opt out of this Agreement during the Term. Notice of such a decision must be made prior to the beginning of the next subscription term and will be effective at the commencement of the next calendar year. In the event a member of the Licensee's Consortium opts out of this Agreement, such consortium member's fee will be deducted from the invoice for the year in which such opting out is to be effective. Should the last Authorized Institution withdraw from the Agreement before the end of the Term, the Agreement shall automatically terminate once the Licensee notifies JHUP as specified in this clause. The termination will take effect at the start of the

next subscription term to which the withdrawal applies.

Subscriber may terminate this Agreement according to Article 90 of the Law on Public Procurement of the Republic of Lithuania.

Subscriber may terminate this Agreement:

- due to a material or persistent breach by JHUP or EBSCO
- in the case of loss of funding by serving a written notice to the other parties.
- The termination will become effective (30) thirty days after the receipt of the written notice unless later term has been specified in the notice. In this case, Subscriber shall pay only for the access during the period of the validity of this Agreement.
- if the License was awarded to JHUP in view of a serious infringement of the obligations under the Treaties and Directive 2014/24/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council of 26 February 2014 on public procurement and repealing Directive 2004/18/EC that has been declared by the Court of Justice of the European Union in a procedure pursuant to Article 258 TFEU (Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union).
- if the Agreement has been subject to a substantial modification.
- if JHUP should have been excluded during the procurement procedure
- if EBSCO should have been excluded during the procurement procedure
- If EBSCO does not submit an invoice.
- if the international sanctions are applied to JHUP according to the Law on International Sanctions of the Republic of Lithuania.

upon termination of this Agreement according to this clause, EBSCO shall reimburse to Subscriber a pro rata proportion of the then remaining paid Fee for the unexpired period of this Agreement.

The parties agree that this Agreement shall remain silent as to the governing law. No provision herein shall be construed as an agreement to apply the laws of any particular jurisdiction, and the determination of applicable law shall be made in accordance with the relevant conflict-of-law principles.

EBSCO shall issue only an electronic invoice to Subscriber. EBSCO may use any means of an electronic invoice if it is in line with the European standard on electronic invoicing as prescribed by the Commission implementing decision (EU) 2017/1870 of 16 October 2017 on the publication of the reference of the European standard on electronic invoicing and the list of its syntaxes pursuant to Directive 2014/55/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council. Electronic invoices, which are not compatible with the European standard on electronic invoicing should be issued via SABIS informational system (<https://sabis.nbfc.lt/>) if functionality for foreign suppliers to issue invoices in English will be available. Licensee accepts the electronic invoices and processes them using the means of SABIS information system except if, in the event of mobilization, war or emergency, there are violations of the information system SABIS, which makes it impossible to communicate and exchange information between the Licensee and the Publisher using SABIS.

Annex 1 shall have the same force and effect as if expressly set in the body of this Agreement and any reference to this Agreement shall include Annex 1. In case of contradiction between the Agreement and Annexes, Annex 1 (The Tender) shall prevail. The parties acknowledge that the License Agreement, its schedules and the Tender shall be published on Lithuanian Central Public Procurement Information System. The Parties undertake to process personal data only under the conditions specified in this Agreement, in compliance with Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC, the Law on Legal Protection of Personal Data of the Republic of Lithuania, and other legal acts governing the processing and protection of personal data.
