



Declaration of compliance with Battery Directive 2006/66/EC and Commission Regulation 1103/2010/EU

Samsung Electronics hereby declares that all batteries placed on the European Union internal market after 26th September 2008 are compliant with EC Directive 2006/66/EC on batteries and accumulators and waste batteries and accumulators. From 30th of May 2012, where applicable, batteries will comply with Commission regulation 1103/2010/EU as regards capacity labeling of portable secondary (rechargeable) and automotive batteries and accumulators.

Batteries supplied with Samsung Electronics products comply with the following requirements:

1. Batteries do not contain the following substances:
 - i. Mercury exceeding:
 - 2% by weight for button cell batteries
 - 0.0005% by weight for all other batteries
 - ii. Cadmium exceeding:
 - 0.002% by weight
2. Information about proper disposal of Batteries in accordance with Art. 20 of the Battery Directive is provided to end-users for all Samsung branded products using batteries.
3. Batteries are labeled in accordance with Art. 21 of the Battery Directive, including marking of the crossed-out wheeled-bin symbol, the chemical symbols Hg, Cd and/or Pb and the capacity marking, where applicable.
4. All products are designed so that batteries are readily removable by the end user or a professional during the lifetime of the product; or at end of life where the battery does not normally require replacement during the lifetime of the product

Samsung Electronics is member of an approved batteries producer compliance scheme in all EU countries where it has a legal presence in accordance with national law.
