

**Statement on the relevance of the list of the Robert Koch-Institute of approved disinfectants and implications for the use of Sekusept aktiv**

By German law on the prevention of infections ("Infektionsschutzgesetz") the German health authority Robert Koch-Institute issues a list of disinfectants for cases of authority demanded disinfection in the case of epidemics. Tests performed to be accepted for this list reflect extreme situations to create a high margin of safety for this case. By no means these application conditions are intended for routine use.

Sekusept aktiv is listed on the list of the Robert Koch-Institute for the case of authority demanded disinfection in the case of epidemics with tuberculocidal efficacy at 2% with 1 h contact time. However, for routine use the following application conditions can be recommended:

- Bactericidal, yeasticidal and mycobactericidal (including tuberculocidal) efficacy according to EN 13727, EN 13624, EN 14348, EN 14561, EN 14562, EN 14563<sup>1)</sup> under clean and dirty conditions:  
2% 5 min
- Effective against spores of *C. difficile*<sup>2)</sup>:  
2% 5 min
- Sporicidal according to EN 13704<sup>3)</sup>:  
2% 15 min
