I confirm that under Council Directive 2006/88/EC as implemented in Commission Decision 2009/177/EC Great Britain (GB) is recognised as free from the following fish and shellfish diseases:

GB has also been recognised as free from Ostreid herpesvirus 1 μ var (OsHV-1 μ var) (Except 4 stretches of coast), Gyrodactylus salaris (Gs) and Spring viraemia of carp (SVC) under Commission Decision 2010/221/EU.

UK Glass Eels - Causeway is situated in a zone that is considered free from all of the above.
